

## 2024 PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

#### <u>Purpose</u>

The Adopt-A-Parking Lot Program exists to welcome visitors in our public downtown parking lots. Parking lots set the tone for visitors; often the first visual representation of the community as they head toward their destination. Parking lots enhance the visitor experience when median gardens are tended and litter is diligently removed.

#### <u>Overview</u>

Main Street Marshfield is seeking Adopt-A-Parking Lot partners to create a welcoming environment in the downtown public parking lots. Each lot requires two partners: a funding partner and a volunteer partner. Partners may be organizations, businesses, clubs, or individuals. A single entity may also decide to both take on funding and volunteering for a parking lot. Volunteers can expect to spend a couple of hours every other week on their assigned parking lot. Parking lots will be pre-mulched by the City of Marshfield's Parks and Recreation. Trees in lots are also under management of Parks and Recreation.

### **Program Timeline**

- May 13th, 2024 Applications Due
- May 30th, 2024 Recommended Deadline for Plant Installation, in time for Dairyfest.
- September-October Program Wind Down (weather dependent) *Time to prune, remove, reset.*
- January 2025 New applications available Previous sponsors and volunteers reserve the right of first refusal on their lots.

### Partnership Requirements & Benefits

- 2024 Funding Partner
  - **Requirement:** \$500 Cash Sponsorship
    - Soil, Fertilizer, Plants *\$300*
    - Downtown Beautification Fund *\$100*
    - Administrative Costs \$100

## • <u>2024 Volunteer Partner</u>

- Requirement: Volunteers must tend to assigned lot & median gardens from late May through September. Main Street will refund up to \$300 toward soil prep, flowers/plants, or fertilizer. Any unspent monies of the \$300 will be placed in the Downtown Beautification Fund. Volunteer responsibilities include:
  - Soil preparation
    - Mulch is provided by Parks & Recreation prior to the volunteer planting season.
    - Preening can help prevent weeds.
  - Plant purchasing, selection, installation
    - No edibles, woody plants, DNR invasive species, or noxious weeds are allowed.
  - Weeding
    - Weeding every other week will keep lots looking beautiful.
  - Watering
    - There is no direct access to water at lots, so water must be brought in. Native plants/drought tolerant plants can assist with less frequent watering schedules.
  - Litter pickup and disposal off-site May through September
    - All commercial dumpsters downtown are personal property of local businesses and should not be used for disposal. Garbage and weeds must be taken off site.
  - End of year pruning or removal of plants to prepare ground for next year.
  - Note: Environmentally-friendly gardening is highly recommended to protect pollinators and water systems.

# **Downtown Lot Plant Installation & Maintenance 101**

### • Flower & Plant Types

- A combination of foliage + flowering annuals + perennials is recommended.
  - Something as simple and forgiving as ornamental grasses and petunias will make a big impact!

#### Installation

- 1) Space plants out at least 12 inches apart.
- 2) Dig a hole three times the size of the pot and fill with fresh potting soil.
- 3) Plant the plant in the hole, recover with soil and mulch.
- 4) Water plant once installed.
- Watering
  - Water installed plants at least once a week or every two weeks.
- Fertilizing
  - Fertilize plants every 2-3 weeks with a balanced, water soluble fertilizer.
- Weeding
  - Pull weeds at least every other week. Dispose of weeds at the City compost site.
